## COURSE GRADE

Your grade is based on lecture quizzes (15 points), weekly homework assignments and quizzes (25 points), 2 midterm exams (100 points each), and a final exam (200 points).

Your grade for the course is based on the higher of the following: 1) a grade scale that totals 440 points from the entire semester's work or 2) a grade scale that totals 200 points based only on the final exam (aka the Dutch knockout).

Course grades are set according to a scale that is determined the day **after** the final exam. Thus, tests are not assigned letter grades.

#### LECTURE QUIZZES

There is an online quiz after every lecture. The number of questions you answer correctly over the entire semester determines your points from lecture quizzes. These points are allocated as follows:

< 40 correct answers = 0 points.

41-50 correct answers = 10 points.

51+ correct answers = 15 points.

#### WEEKLY HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS AND QUIZZES

Weekly homework assignments are graded for accuracy and weekly quizzes are graded for completion. It is possible to earn more than 25 points from weekly homework assignments and quizzes.

## MIDTERM EXAMS

Test 01 and Test 02 have two parts: in-class and take-home. If you are unable to take Test 01 or Test 02 at the scheduled time because of intercollegiate competition, illness, or an emergency, and if you notify me of your situation in advance (unless it is an extreme emergency), I will excuse you from the exam and, in its place, the final exam will count for 300 points. If you miss both midterms (with valid excuses for each one of them), then the final exam will count for 400 points. You must submit an excuse with proper documentation that must be approved by me **within 1 week after the missed test**.
